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A Grandmothers Story

Spring is my favorite time of year. All of nature is coming back to life after winter and with all the colors of the flowers, trees and the green grass waking up! To me one can't help but be happy during the spring. Plus this spring I was extra happy as in a few weeks, my third grandchild would be born!

It was Thursday morning May 10th and I was on my way to work when my cell phone rang. "Come home quick, they can't find the baby's heartbeat." The first thing I thought of was "how could this be, why, what in the heck is going on, there has to be a mistake."

My heart was breaking for two reasons. One because of the baby but second as a parent you always want to protect your children and take away any hurt or pain they might have. After all that is what a mom is supposed to do, protect her children. However there was no protecting them or taking away the hurt this time. There was nothing I could do to make it "alright".

After doing additional tests and further examining Jessica, they did in fact determined that the baby had indeed died. Jess was at 36 ½ weeks gestation. Since her body hadn't started the process of preparing for the birth, they recommended she carry the baby through the weekend and they would start inducing labor Sunday night. At first I thought this was a terrible idea, however looking back on it now, I can see why they recommended it. One, it gives the body a chance to start preparing for labor but more importantly, it gives the mom a chance to say good-by to the baby. It gives the mom some special time to share with her unborn child. The special time that only a mom and child can share together.

We were all planning on leaving Friday to go camping, with the entire family coming on Sunday to celebrate Mother's Day. To keep busy and to help pass the time (days), we continued with the camping trip. We tried to keep it as happy as possible but under the circumstances how could you. Just looking at Jess I could see a sadness in her eyes that pierced the soul.

On Sunday afternoon, after the mother day celebration was over and everyone left. Jess and Brian left to go to the hospital. We all cried as we knew what was ahead of us. Brian and Jess entered the hospital Sunday evening to start the labor process. On Monday afternoon Brianna was born into the arms of Jesus. She was beautiful! Looking at her and holding her, she looked like she was just sleeping.

The weeks and months that followed were extremely hard and I am not sure how we all got through it, especially Brian and Jess. Again every time I looked at Brian and Jess I just wanted to make everything Ok. But I couldn't. Time does pass and the tears aren't as frequent, but they are always still there, when you least expect it, they come crashing out. I do know that we got through this by leaning on our faith, together as a family and with the support from our friends.

My wish and prayer is that no one has to ever experience this terrible pain. However I do know that if a baby is born as a stillbirth, by you just giving a hug to the mom and dad or anyone else in the family, it lets them know that you care. Words don't ever seem to be enough and we never know to say, so give them a hug and let them know you are there, to share their pain and to listen if they want to talk.

To all parents/grandparents, know that you are loved and that you are in the hearts and thoughts of others that have also experienced this pain. Remember that my (our) prayers are with you. And if and when we meet or see each other, I have a very big hug for you!!
